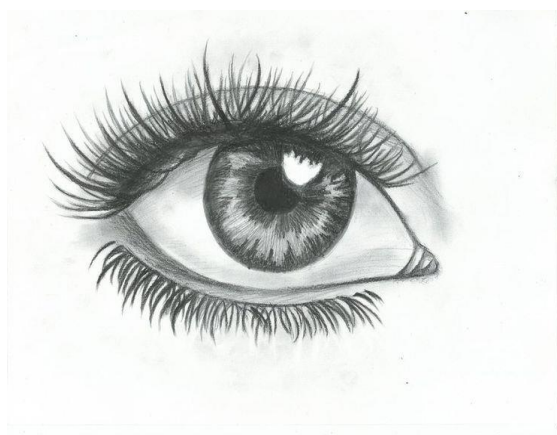

Link – Procedural Writing

Recipe: Apple Crumble



Ingredients:

For the filling:

- 575g Bramley apple (3 medium apples), peeled, cored and sliced
- 2 tablespoon golden caster sugar

For the crumble:

- 175g plain flour
- 110g golden caster sugar
- 110g cold butter

For the topping (optional):

- 1 tablespoon rolled oats
- 1 tablespoon demerara sugar
- Double cream or custard to serve

Method:

1. Heat the oven to 190 C.

2. Toss 575g peeled, cored and sliced Bramley apples with 2 tbsp golden caster sugar and put in a round baking dish.
3. Flatten down with your hand to prevent too much crumble falling through.
4. Put 175g plain flour and 110g golden caster sugar in a bowl.
5. Slice in 110g cold butter and rub it in with your fingertips until the mixture looks like moist breadcrumbs. Shake the bowl and any big bits will come to the surface – rub them in.
6. Pour the crumb mix over the apples, then use a fork to even out.
7. Gently press the surface with the back of the fork so the crumble holds together and goes crisp.
8. **Optional:** Sprinkle 1 tablespoon rolled oats and 1 tablespoon demerara sugar over evenly, if you wish.
9. Put on a baking tray and put in the preheated oven for 35-40 minutes, until the top is golden and the apples feel very soft when you insert a small, sharp knife.
10. Leave to cool for 10 minutes before serving.
