Dear Parents/Guardians,

Congratulations to the children in 6th class who made their Confirmation on Wednesday 24th April. Bishop Connell presided over the Confirmation ceremony and it was lovely to see the two school communities in the parish come together to celebrate Confirmation for the first time in many years. Thank you to Mr.Beirne for his time and effort in preparing the children so well.

Last Saturday, ten of our children from 2nd class made their First Holy Communion. Thanks to Fr.Ber for a lovely ceremony. Thank you to Ms.Mulligan for preparing the children for this important sacrament and especially for all your time and dedication in coordinating and conducting our choir this year. Thanks also to all children involved in our choir on both occasions - your singing stood out on both days. Sincere words of appreciation to our staff members for their help with the organising of the day, the Parents Association for flowers in the Church and the parents of last year's Communion class who provided delicious refreshments after the ceremony.

Children in 5th/6th class and their teachers had a hugely enjoyable visit to Cavan Museum on Friday 3rd May. Thank you to Emma Clancy, Jonas and the staff in the museum for a very enjoyable day. The children enjoyed handling artefacts, modelling World War 1 clothing!, walking through a recreation of an actual trench whilst also stepping back to the time of the Uprising in 1916. The tour ended with the children exploring the museum to find answers to clues to complete a museum booklet.

On Friday 10th May, a special gathering took place on the grounds of our school as part of the 50th Anniversary Celebrations of the opening of Moyne Community School. Our school was originally built as a vocational school. From 1940 to 1974 secondary school children attended our school. There was a lovely plaque presented to our school which was unveiled by Michael Denning, a former woodwork teacher who would have taught in the current 5th/6th classroom.
